Dear Friends,

Spring is upon us once again and with it comes the annual ritual of the assessment of winter trail damage and needed repairs, clean up, and downed tree removal. I am reminded every year at this time of how fortunate we are that a small, prescient group saw the need to work with landowners to map the trails and maintain and preserve the trail network in Essex County. Thus, in 1982, the Essex County Trail Association was formed. Its stated mission was to maintain and preserve trails for the purpose of passive recreation and for the benefit of the community. That same vision exists today as we celebrate ECTA's 35th anniversary.

Today, ECTA works on over 450 miles of trails in Essex County and holds 30 easements on private property which we maintain and over which we are granted privilege to pass. The Board of Directors now includes 15 people ... there are 27 Trail Stewards who report maintenance and repair needs and 28 members of the Advisory Board whom we call on for assistance on a variety of things. As the world has changed and technology has become a big factor in our everyday lives, it has become even more important to have access to nature and be able to get out into the country to run, cross country ski, ride a bicycle, ride a horse, walk your dog or simply breathe deeply and have a guiet walk in the woods. Our aim is to continue to respect and protect access to the outdoors for everyone to enjoy its beauty every day.

In 2017, we will be renewing the Townwide Trail Management plans for Hamilton, Essex and Wenham. A lot of the trail repairs we do are within buffer zones, so having these plans in place saves us considerable time and money.

The challenge with the permitting has been the changing of state regulations. Two years ago, the regulations for culvert repair and maintenance changed drastically. We are no longer able to replace a culvert in kind as we have done in the past. Now a 2-foot culvert may have to be replaced with a 9.5-foot culvert based on state regulations for roadways. Our important work this year has been to determine the best way to solve stream crossings based on current regulations while keeping the best interest of trail users in mind. We need to ensure the best solution for a positive future.

Trail Repairs along the Ipswich River

The ECTA continues to work on the trails along the Ipswich River. Last year we repaired the trail that goes from Waldingfield Farm down to the river crossing. This year we are working to repair the trail on the other side of the river from Mill Road to just before Judy Little's property. We have received permission for this part of the project from the Ipswich Conservation Commission and work will be done according to the Townwide Trail Management Plan.

Last fall, Tim Hilton contacted us to say that he recently purchased property along the trail and wanted to bring the trail back to its condition of 50 years ago. He wanted to continue to have it used by equestrians as it was in the past. His family has a long history in the area and the connectivity and openness of the past were all very important to him. The Lingerman Family have graciously given their permission for work to be done on their property as well.

The ECTA will repair two wet areas along the river, repair the trail on both sides of the bridge and then continue to where it goes up the hill into the field at Holiday Hill. Specifically we will include water bars on the hill and add fabric/pack/gravel to the wet areas. It is important that we build the trail up as it is very deep from erosion and make it drier. Work will begin in the spring when the ground dries out.


