## **Appleton Farms Trail Ride Highlights Farm History**

One of the oldest continuously operating farms in the country, Appleton Farms was established and maintained by nine generations of the Appleton family. Eventually gifted to The Trustees of Reservations by Colonel Francis R. Appleton, Jr., and his wife Joan Appleton, the property is currently divided into to portions, referred to as Appleton Farms and Appleton Farms Grass Rides. The farm side of the property is open to equestrians and pedestrians and closed to dogs, while the Grass Rides are open to dog walkers but not horses.

With over five miles of grass lanes bordered by woods, the Grass Rides were originally created for carriage driving and horseback riding. As the tree canopy closed in over the years, the grass cover became thin and the footing was easily damaged by horses, leading to the decision to limit the area to hiking, running and dog walking.

When talking with local riders about the Grass Rides, ECTA Board Member Susanna Colloredo-Mansfeld was surprised that many people were unaware of the history of the farm and did not recognize the nicknames given to points of interest within the property. She realized that we are slowly losing a part of this rich history as older members of the community stop using the trails or move out of the area.

Susanna and Trustees of Reservations Deputy Director of Greater Boston & Northeast Regions Peter Pinciaro worked together to come up with a way that they could reconnect equestrians with the history of a place many ride through often. They came up with the idea of a guided horseback tour of the farm, with a special opportunity to ride through the Grass Rides trails and Great Pasture.

Thirty-five riders gathered in the stone paddock on the morning of October 18th and were welcomed by Barbara Sears, Fred Winthrop and Bill Shields. Next they followed a route past Frank Sr.'s pinnacle to the Prince of Wales Avenue, meeting Ollie Wolcott at Fannie's Pinnacle for additional history of the farm. After passing Joan Appleton's memorial wall on The Plains, riders gathered

#### **Run for the Trails Celebrates 10 Years**

Saturday, September 20th marked the 10th anniversary of ECTA's Run for the Trails and with 122 competitors turning out, this was one of our most successful years to date! The 5 and 10 mile courses start at the Myopia Schooling Field in Hamilton and follow trails through Harvard Forest, Appleton Farms Grass Rides and Greenbelt's Pingree Woods. The 10-mile course is part of the increasingly popular North Shore Trail Series sponsored by New England Running and Salomon.

The overall winner for the men's 10-mile race was David Long with a time of 1:01:45 and the women's 10-mile leader was Emma Kosciak coming in at 1:10:46. 5-mile race winners were Annika Rogers (40:05) and Alan Jutras (45:39). In celebration of our milestone anniversary, we awarded "Most Years Raced" honors to Franz Buzawa (10 years) and Cynthia Brown (8 years). Franz was also recognized for his achievement of "Most Times Off Course the Second Time Around" and Monadnock Mountain Water was honored for "Most Years Sponsored." We also noted the course records held in each division, with Andy King holding the overall 5-mile record of 31:12 set in 2006 and Patrick Rich holding the overall 10-mile record at 58:30 set in 2010.



We have recently started hosting 'Trail Summit' meetings at the shop to bring different user groups together and educate people on the state of the trails around here. Our first one was well attended and had representation from ECTA, Cape Ann Trails Association, Essex County Greenbelt, and New England Mountain Bike Association, as well as a number of trail users."







# **ECTA Jumps to Action After Microburst**

On September 6th a microburst hit our area causing severe damage from Cutler Road in Hamilton to just north of downtown Ipswich. Many trees and branches came down along trails at Groton House, Appleton Farms, the Bird Reservation and other properties in the area. ECTA trail stewards hit the trails on Sunday and reported back to us with maps, photos and detailed descriptions of blocked trails. Property owners and volunteers stepped in to clear what they could, and ECTA hired contractors to handle the bigger jobs.

One of the hardest hit areas was the Ipswich River Watershed Association, where several massive trees fell across their recently expanded trail network. We were able to utilize resources from the DCR Recreational Trails Grant we received in 2013 to cover part of the cost of the tree removal.







## **Volunteers Create New Prospect Hill Trail**

Prospect Hill, located on the Ipswich-Rowley town line near Rt. 1A, consists of a network of trails including the Bay Circuit Trail. The existing Bay Circuit Trail on the south side of the hill had become dangerously eroded. The upper part of the trail followed the fall line of the hill and had become a drainage gully, full of loose rocks and dirt. The lower part of the trail had been eroded from underneath in one area, leaving a hole about 4 feet deep that a foot or hoof could easily step in.


With no simple solutions for repairing the existing trail, ECTA worked with members of the Bay Circuit Alliance to relocate the trail to a ridge line with a more gradual slope just to the west of the original route.

Twenty-one volunteers, ranging in age from four to over seventy joined us for a Trail Work Day on October 25th to create the new trail, cutting back limbs and brush, moving logs and rocks, and posting trail markers. We are extremely grateful to REI for their generous grant funding for this project, and to Stihl for lending and donating

equipment for our volunteers. We would also like to thank the Bay Circuit Alliance, the Ipswich Bay Circuit Trail Committee and the Appalachian Mountain Club for supporting this project with volunteers.

in front of the Kentucky Gate for a brief talk by Nat Pulsifer and a "spirited" live demonstration of the gate! After entering the Grass Rides, riders followed the Charles Linnear Appleton Mile to Round Point, marked by the pinnacle dedicated in his honor. After passing the fourth pinnacle at Pigeon Hill honoring Frank Appleton, Jr. the ride finished in the Great Pasture, which is actively grazed by the farm's dairy cows and is usually closed to horses.

This special ride is the first of many that ECTA plans to host with the goal of reconnecting trail users with the history of the places they enjoy.


