Dear Friends,

Spring is a very busy season for us! We're making plans for this year's trail work and have several projects lined up, two of which are funded by grants we've recently received. Carol Lloyd, our Director of Trail Maintenance and Management, has been working on easements and documenting trail connections, in addition to prioritizing and overseeing trail projects. See her report on pages 4 & 5.

We've updated all of our town wide trail maps! With roughly 450 miles of trails in Ipswich, Hamilton, Wenham, Topsfield and West Newbury, this was a large undertaking. Our maps are available in several formats, including through a free phone app. See Outreach Coordinator Stacie Capotosto's description of our maps and where to find them on Page 3.

We have a busy schedule of trail events planned! Each year we host trail events for all types of trail users, such as runners, horseback riders, bird watchers, mountain bikers, and new this year, dog lovers! We added a canicross event on March 25th that we hope to make annual, Tails for the Trails, a 5k race held at beautiful Pipestave Hill Recreation Area in West Newbury. These events are an important source of funding for our trail work, and with each event we introduce new trail enthusiasts to the outstanding trail networks in our area. Our biggest event of the year, and a fun gathering outdoors under a big tent at Groton House Farm, is our annual Summer Solstice Party on June 17th. This is a great opportunity to support ECTA while enjoying great food, live music, and fantastic silent auctions items, in a gorgeous field setting.

As always, we're so grateful for the support of our wonderful volunteers and trail stewards, who are generous with their time and enable us to put on events and handle overseeing such a vast area of trails. We equally grateful to our sponsors, members, and generous donors, who provide us with the funds we count on to do our work. It's because of each of you that we are able to do all that we do! On March 25, thirty-two runners plus their canine teammates completed a scenic 5k cross country course at ECTA's first West Newbury trail event. Each competitor wore a waist belt attached by a bungee leash to a harnessed dog. The well marked course started atop Pipestave Hill, streamed across open fields, then circled down to the Mill Pond, around the Town Forest, and back through the equine jump fields to the finish line.

From huskies to hounds, sheepdogs to corgis, the competitors were enthusiastic and cooperative, and came from as far as Maine and Connecticut. The top 11 teams all finished in less than 20 minutes! Winners included:

Participants were rewarded with soup and snacks provided by Coastal Greengrocer, and winning teams received prizes donated by the Essex County Co-op, the Natural Dog, Nooksack Racing Supply, and New England Running. Race sponsors included Institution for Savings, Mayer Tree Service, Ipswich Ale, and the Natural Dog. Sweet Paws Dog Rescue also brought adoptable pups, and spectators enjoyed cheering on their favorite canicrossers in a beautiful setting. All agreed that this was a terrific event and should take place annually.

Our paper maps are available from our Wenham office and several local retailers: New England Running in Beverly, The Natural Dog in Hamilton, Riverside Cycle in Manchester-by-the-Sea, the Ipswich Visitor Center, Wenham Sports Stop, The Bicycle Shop of Topsfield, and the G.A.R Memorial Library in West Newbury. Each of our five town wide trail maps are also available digitally through the Avenza Maps mobile app to be used for navigation via GPS. Both the Avenza Maps app and our digital maps are free. Through Avenza Maps, our maps can be downloaded and used on your mobile device anywhere, without a cellphone signal. You can also record your track's distance and time. TRAIL MAINTENANCE SPRING 2023




SPRING HAS COME EARLY THIS YEAR! IT HAS BEEN A REAL TREAT TO WALK THE TRAILS AND SEE THE FLOWERS AND ALL THE GREEN IN MAY! WE ARE PLANNING SOME GOOD PROJECTS AS WE HEAD INTO THE DRIER SUMMER MONTHS.

Gardner Street Trail

The trail starting from Gardner Street along the Miles River to the Ford Bridge was previously owned by HWOLT and has recently been transferred to Greenbelt. It is currently the only trail connection going past Biolabs. As a result, it has received a lot of use and the trail is showing it. There are two big mud spots at the Gardner Street end that get bigger with rain and use. ECTA was able to

permit this project under the Townwide Trail Management Plan. We also received a Mass Trails Grant to do the work. The work will consist of removing some of the mud then adding fabric to stabilize the trail and tailings and pack on top of that to keep it dry year-round. We hope to be in there as soon as the ground dries out. Stay tuned for the after pictures!





Ford Bridge Beaver Deceiver

As you continue down the Gardner Street trail, you will come to the Ford Bridge that we replaced in 2021. Soon after it was replaced, a small beaver dam appeared. It continued to grow over the years. Last fall we noticed that the water level on the downstream side of the dam was 1-2 feet lower than it was upstream of the dam. Trails were starting to get wet at times when there wasn't a high water event. We had Skip Lisle of Beaver Deceivers International look at it and it was clear that it needed a flow device to manage the water level. Again, we were able to permit it as part of the Townwide Trail Management Plan and money was raised for the device. The work will be done sometime in the next couple of months.



DCR's Gordon Hayden retires

We recently learned that our dear friend Gordon Hayden is retiring. Gordon has been a Park Ranger for DCR at Bradley Palmer and Willowdale for the past 51 years! He

has been a wonderful partner and will be missed greatly. Gordon is the one we would call when trees fell on trails, when we needed help with a project, when we had any questions at all. Always cheerful, always kind, and if he didn't have an answer to a question, he would find it. You always felt as though you were Gordon's highest priority even though you knew he had 10 other things going at the same time! Gordon was a wonderful steward of the land and a great friend to ECTA. We thank him for his help over the years and wish him the best in his next chapter.

Warren Weld Bog Bridge — Completed

Warren Weld Reservation is a property in Essex off Apple Street that is owned by Essex County Greenbelt. Its trails are open to all passive recreation and are used regularly by the public. There was a section of trail that had become very wet and was impassable during high water periods. It borders a large wetland. The beavers in this wetland had dammed the outlet which raised the water level. We took a good look at this trail to determine the best fix. One solution was to install a beaver deceiver to lower the water and dry out the trail. Another solution was to build a simple bog bridge. Because the wetland was so beautiful and thriving, we chose option 2 as the best solution. We worked with Greenbelt on this project. We were able to permit it under ECTA's Essex Townwide Trail Management Plan and Greenbelt put the bog bridge together. It was the perfect solution and keeps the trail users dry year-round.
