A View from the Chair

Dear Friends,

Every year, the onset of spring brings sounds and color back to our landscapes and also a sense of renewal and anticipation of warm sunny days ahead. Our migratory birds have returned, and the air is filled with the calls of nesting songbirds. Everything is budding, blooming and the grass is a vibrant deep green thanks to the abundant rain we've had in recent weeks. Following a year when we've been confined by a pandemic, this sense of renewal and expectation of better days ahead is much needed.

The last year has been an interesting one for ECTA. What started out as a complete cancellation of any events or activities that brought people onto close contact soon became an effort to provide information to the throngs of people using the trails. As huge numbers of people turned to trails for relief from COVID stress, we stepped up our efforts to provide guidance and keep trails clear. My husband and I were walking with our dogs last summer on a remote trail deep in a Boxford forest and at our favorite scenic spot found a couple enjoying the view. They were from Boston, and feeling desperate to escape their apartment they'd been exploring trails in Essex County every chance they got. They were not alone! Interest in trails and appreciation for natural landscapes has soared in the last year. For this reason, 2020 turned out to be a good year for organizations involved in the preservation of our natural environment and its passive recreational trails – including ECTA.

As a result, ECTA has grown in the past year! Our membership is up nearly 20%, we've updated our website and are focusing on ways to share information that's of benefit to trail users. Most importantly, we're expanding our trail work as well, and are taking on more projects this year. In addition, we've applied for a MassTrails grant for a Geographic Informative System (GIS) project that if awarded later this year, will be hugely beneficial to us in identifying and prioritizing trail projects. See Carol Lloyd's report on pages 4 and 5 for more details. Finally, we've added a new director, Frank Lane. Frank is an avid mountain biker and leader of the North Shore Chapter of New England Mountain Bike Association. He's a great addition to our Board!

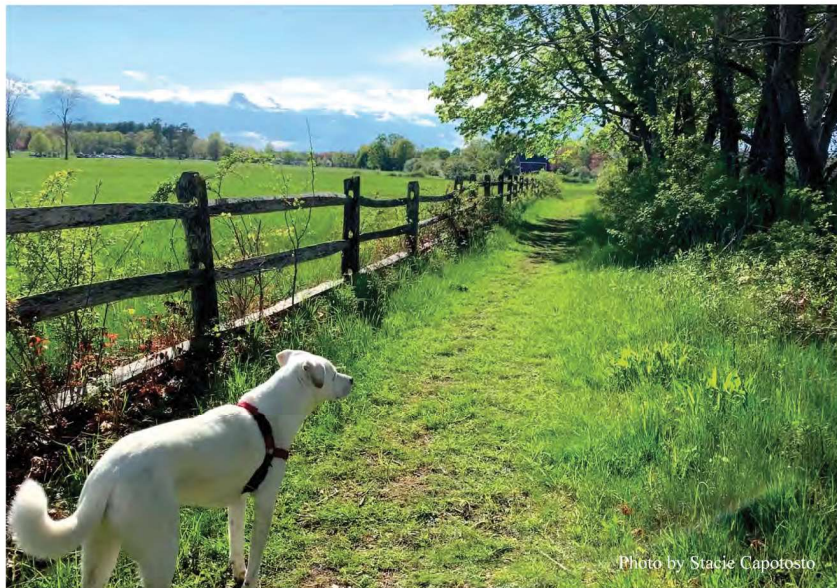

We're looking forward to a busy 2021, and hopefully, a new phase in safely emerging from the pandemic. Over the past year, we've updated and enhanced our website in order to provide visitors with current information about ECTA and the trails in the six towns we serve – Essex, Hamilton, Ipswich, Topsfield, Wenham and West Newbury. We've added a new feature to the website – Trail User Reports. This feature provides a place where all of us can share what we encounter out on the trails. Read other users' posts about current trail conditions before you head out. Snap a photo of something on a trail you would like to share with others and post it with a short description on Trail User Reports. This easy to use new feature can be found on our homepage or in the Trails drop down menu.

As winter turned to spring this year, we kicked off our membership drive and began to build our 2021 Events Calendar. The Spring for the Trails half marathon in early May was held virtually over 8 days but we are planning to hold our Run for the Trails 5/10-mile trail race and our Thanks for the Trails 5k as in-person, one day events, in the fall. Our 2nd annual TrifECTA Trail Challenge began May 14th and will run through July 11th. This event is a fun opportunity for all types of trail users - walkers, runners, equestrians, bikers, and families – to challenge themselves and win some great prizes.

Our annual Trail Ride in Memory of Patrick Keough was held Saturday June 5th. We held a guided bird walk that same day, June 5th, in honor of National Trails Day. We are planning a twilight trail ride with the West Newbury Riding and Driving Club at the end of June in memory of Joe Sandulli, who loved group rides of this kind. The 26th Annual Equine Tack and Paraphernalia Sale at the Topsfield Fairgrounds will be August 21st. Along with a mountain bike event in October we are planning on adding other new events and programs now that we are able to safely gather once again.

Thank you all for your support, especially over this difficult year. I look forward to seeing you in person sometime soon!

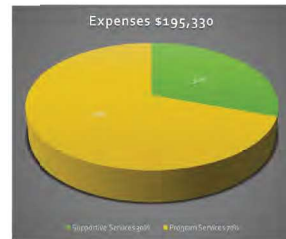

In Memory of Joseph Sandulli

1944-2021

Joe was already an ECTA Director from Ipswich when I joined the Board ten years ago. He always knew where all the trails were, having explored with the Myopia Hunt and on his own on his Arabian equine partner, Simi and later his beloved horse Prince, from Rowley to Essex, Newbury to Wenham. Once West Newbury joined ECTA he made sure he learned those trails too.

Joe was always curious and was the definition of a life-long learner. He earned a reputation as a respected legal mind, and used those skills to benefit the public by preserving access, communicating with landowners and making improvements to trails in all six ECTA towns and beyond.

Joe chaired the ECTA Trail Committee for many years, hosting monthly meetings at his home and strategizing where next to spend our resources and volunteers. He organized many of ECTA's trail rides and XC ski outings, leading us across Biolabs, along rail trails and up Sagamore Hill. He made every gathering and event special, with his ready smile and insightful perspective.

One of my own special memories is of star-gazing with Joe from the mile-high roof deck of the Bar NI Ranch in Colorado after a full day of mountain trail riding. He knew all the stars. And I'll never forget riding out onto Moon Hill behind Joe and Chris, his devoted wife and partner, under a summer solstice full moon at Bradley Palmer, with fireflies dancing all around us.

Joe rode fearlessly, and explored endlessly. I picture him riding first flight with Myopia Hunt, close behind the Master, Don Little, boldly jumping over the biggest stone walls. He loved the opportunities to travel the trails on horseback, and felt fortunate that he lived where he could do so.

We at ECTA are grateful for his friendship, and for the chance to share his generous gifts and talents.

Thanks to all of our wonderful trail stewards and trail users who identified all of the trees for us, we were either able to get them ourselves or notify the land-owners who like to do their own work. Some were simple tree removals, others required working with conservation to remove it as part of our Townwide Trail Management Plan.

In addition to ongoing trail maintenance we were able to complete some big projects including:

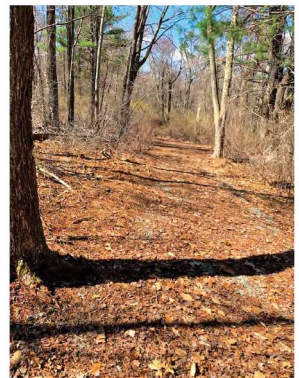
- New Beaver Deceiver, trail #41, Willowdale State Park

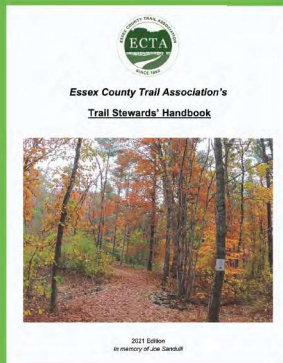

MOWING & TRAIL MAINTENANCE

Much time was spent mowing. We concentrated on the areas that we usually keep open and did them multiple times. We also mowed areas that hadn't been done in a while to make sure we kept as much open as we could.

TRAIL STEWARDS' HANDBOOK

As a result of more people out on the trails, we received a lot of requests from people who wanted to volunteer to help us maintain them. To provide some guidance for our Stewards and others who are interested, we created a Trail Stewards' Handbook. It includes information about our process, and what individuals can do to improve the trails. Please let us know if you would like one and we would be happy to provide it.



Last year we renewed our Townwide Trail Management Plans. As you all know, these plans are pre-approved best practices for trail maintenance that allow us to work in resource areas without filing a notice of intent each time, saving us a lot of time and money when doing our trail work. This year was great because we did a couple of new/innovative things with our renewals. In four towns they were approved in perpetuity so we don't have to renew them every three years. In West Newbury, the town filed with us as co-applicant so that they could also benefit from the process. We are going to try this for three years and if it works well, will ask for in perpetuity the next time. Essex was renewed for three years.

We are looking forward to the busy year that we have planned.

In addition to the trail projects we have scheduled, we are really excited about an application that we've submitted for a grant from DCR's MassTrails Grant program. We're asking for funding to develop GPS mapped Trail Maintenance Plans for five of our towns. Wenham has already completed one with our help. For this project we will utilize volunteers to help us locate and map the trail maintenance issues. Using an app designed for data collection of this type, they'll take a picture, we will add the cost estimate to fix the issue, then this information will be placed on a complete trail map of each town. We will then have a master plan of all the maintenance issues so that we will be able to prioritize the work and raise money for each project. Stay tuned!

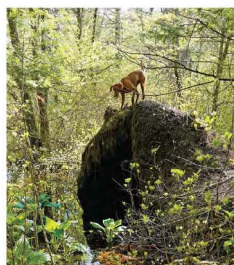
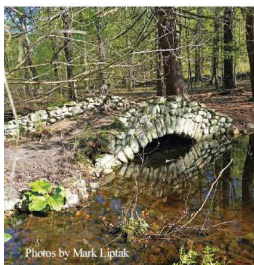
